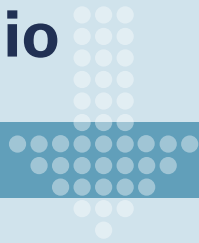

How do I register?

This two hour requirement needs to be satisfied by June 30, 2011.

What is included?

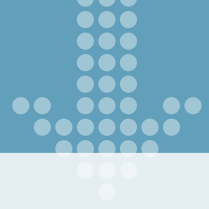
